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Ontario to Dramatically Reduce Mandatory Auto Accident Benefits

Yesterday, Finance Minister Charles Sousa announced further restrictions to Accident Benefits coverage in Ontario.

What are the proposed changes?

- Coverage for catastrophically impaired victims will be **CUT IN HALF**
- Medical rehabilitation benefits for non-cat victims will only be available for 5 years instead of 10
- Non-cat benefits will be **reduced** from \$86,000.00 to \$65,000.00
- Non-earner benefits will be limited to two years

Who does this effect?

- All injured victims from motor vehicle accidents
- The Healthcare System: The OHIP system will be overwhelmed and wait times for critical medical care will dramatically increase

We Must Act Now

Although the proposed changes have been tabled, they have not yet been passed. We have an obligation to do everything necessary to fight these changes before they take effect.
